#### WINE TASTING 1

Our latest tasting on November 2nd was what sometimes is referred to as a "Goldilocks Tasting", where wines are sampled at temperatures that are "too warm" (Papa Bear), "too cool" (Mama Bear), and "just right" (Baby Bear).


We began with a Chardonnay white, successively tasting it firstly at room temperature (71 degrees), then out of the refrigerator (38 degrees) and finally within the recommended range (56 degrees).

We then switched to a Cabernet Sauvignon red, firstly at refrigerator temperature (38 degrees), then at room temperature (71 degrees) and finally within the recommended range (63 degrees).

Each sample was accompanied by a variety of food pairings. We all agreed with the experts that red wines are best enjoyed not at room temperature but several degrees cooler. However, two out of the ten of us still prefer our whites at refrigerator temperatures while the rest of us concur with the experts that not quite so cool tastes better.

All in all, an informative evening with the usual assortment of laughs and good conversation.

Our September tasting dinner was Italian-themed, with Italian foods and wines enjoyed by all. We enjoyed five wines. In order of preference, we enjoyed Fantini Sangiovese (#1), Blu Giovello Pinot Grigio, Giulio Straccali Chianti, Oggi Moscato and, last, Folonari Soave.

Our October tasting dinner was held one week early so as not to conflict with Halloween. It was a spooky event for sure with great decorations by Christy and Andy Cox! The main course was "Ghoul-ash" and there were even ghost-shaped cheese pieces in the salad. The wines were all selected for their names: "SAINTLY" Sauvignon Blanc from the Saintly winery in Niagara, "GHOST PINES" Chardonnay from California, "COFFIN RIDGE - Back from the Dead Red" from Ontario, "CARNIVOR" Cab Sauv from California and "CASILLERO del DIABLO (Devil's Collection) Merlot from Chile. The Saintly and Carnivor wines were the favourites of the evening!


