

The public information meeting to assess the support for a new PROBUS club in the North Durham area was held on April 11th. The waitlists of both the Uxbridge and Port Perry PROBUS were one driver of the meeting, but also the fact that neither club has done any marketing of their clubs since they started, and yet there have been waitlists year after year. So it was anticipated that there might be more demand for memberships than was being reflected in the waitlists.

The result was that over 155 people showed up at the public information meeting, and the registrant list for those interested now exceeds 190 and is still growing. It represents residents from

Scugog, Uxbridge and Brock townships and nearby areas outside of Durham Region. In addition there was interest expressed in the meeting for perhaps another club to focus on the Brock Township and nearby areas (i.e. the more northern part of North Durham), and the numbers of those interested and resident in that area are being reviewed to see if such a club would be viable.

On April 25th a Steering committee met to start a new PROBUS club in the southern part of North Durham and is now planning that club. We'll keep you posted on how those efforts are progressing.



"Tips for Seniors"

Did you miss our April Speaker? **HERE'S A RECAP**

Our guest speaker was Shannon Sheppard who gave a very descriptive presentation of the signs and symptoms of hearing loss, and the possible causes.

She encouraged people of all ages to get a hearing test to determine a base line and that the results of said hearing tests should be given to the family doctor as part of the person's medical history.

Shannon provided information about the three types of clinics in the community that offer hearing tests. Some are private for profit, some are owned by pharmaceutical companies and some are clinics with a Doctor of Audiology, an audiologist on staff.

Her main recommendation was that it is extremely important to have hearing tests as it may be hazardous to your overall health not to do so.
